DIOCESAN MISSION MONTH

He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned...

Then the disciples went out and preached everywhere, and the Lord worked with them and confirmed his word by the signs that accompanied it. (Mark 16:15-16,20)

The mandate to preach the Gospel to the whole world is a non-negotiable command for every Christian, every Church. We are grateful for the churches and missionaries who obeyed the Lord and brought the Gospel to us, and are blessed in the life and hope in Christ. Today, we are also entrusted with the same mandate and baton to bring the Gospel to nations and peoples who have yet to hear the Gospel of Christ.

Therefore, the month of November is designated as Diocesan Mission Month with the purpose to pray and support our Diocesan church-planting and mission-related ministries within and beyond the shores of Sabah. Mission is both local and global.

By *Local*, we mean spreading the Gospel within our community, towns, cities, state and nation. We praise God for all our churches taking initiatives to start new ministries, new church plants, church building projects within our context in Sabah.

By *Global*, it means stepping out beyond local boundaries, bridging languages and culture to build lasting connections and ensuring the mission's impact is relevant and sustainable. For more than 30 years, the Province of South East Asia is committed to plant and grow churches to be independent dioceses in the 8 countries within its purview i.e. Indonesia, Thailand, Laos, Vietnam, Cambodia, Nepal, Brunei, Timor Leste. The Diocese of Sabah has been actively involved in Indonesia and Thailand.

We praise God that our Diocese's ministries in North Kalimantan is growing steadily. We aim to upgrade three churches (Tarakan, Nunukan and Seimenggaris) to Parish status and to create an Archdeaconry of North Kalimantan within the next three to five years. We have also established a sister-church partnership between Rangsit Anglican Church with Faith Christian Center and Good Samaritan Church for continual support and ministry oversight.

We have also concluded our Students Ministry in Miri (Curtin Ministry) after 18 years ministering to Sabahans studying in Curtin University, Miri. We thank God for all the clergy and staff who have served faithfully from Sabah. We are also grateful for many of the students are serving faithfully in their respective churches after their Curtin University life.

I encourage all of us to pray that personally, church and diocese will continue to be missional as called and commanded by the Lord. I also appeal to all to give generously to the Diocesan Mission Fund. This fund is used to support salaries of clergy and missionaries in the mission field, ministry-operational costs, etc. For your information, the Diocese allocated about RM200,000 for operational costs. This excludes assets and infrastructure investment (e.g.: new church buildings, purchase of lands), and direct mission expenses from churches involved in missions both local and global.
